Mountain Biking – Steve Mitchell

OMBP - Workday April 8th 8:30 am to 11 am

Odessa Mountain Bike Park – The trails are in good shape right now. The weeds and mesquite are presently in check however we have a trash problem, especially in the area adjacent to Billy Hext road. Most of the trash is blowing into the park and It has become an eyesore. Jack Henry, Eric Urquidi and I are organizing a **Workday at the OMBP on April 8**th **from 8:30 am to 11 am**. We will supply trash bags. We also plan to clean up a few sections of trail. Please come help us for a few hours. Bring work gloves and a rake or hoe if you have them. We will also have trail tools available. If we can get 20 volunteers, we can clean up the park quickly. There are also still sections of trail that can be adopted. Please contact Jack Henry if you and some friends are interested.

Midland Trail Park - The Midland "Blue Trail" is in excellent shape right now. The berms and trail are very well packed with very little sand. The vegetation is cut back well off the trail. This is in part due to the efforts of VIM racing and PBBA volunteers that prepped the Blue Trail for the first race held at the Midland Park. The Vim and Vigor Race series stage 2, took place on March 11th. Approximately 60 racers along with many fans and spectators showed up for the race. It was a well run race on a well defined 4 mile race loop which included most of the blue loop. The expert class rode three laps with some very fast lap times. The race was managed by Oscar Salazar with help from Clif Coleman, Russell Potter, and a few other helpful volunteers. Dan and Shauna Saxton did a great job timing the event.














Pump Track Status – The new pump track is scheduled to be asphalted in Mid-April. The PBBA voted to help pay a portion of the costs associated with adding the asphalt surface. The PBBA's financial contribution will really help get this project completed. The Track ended up nearly 800 feet long and approximately 8 feet wide. The pump track is a great addition to the cycling community and the only professionally built pump track in the area.

Big Spring State Park – Although the PBBA does not manage the trails at BSSP, it is in the club's interest to help maintain the trails. Some of the local residents do make an effort but most of the cycling traffic is generally from Midland or Odessa. ViM Racing has scheduled **Part 3 of the Vim and Vigor race series at BSSP on May 13**th. The PBBA will be coordinating with VIM to have a workday at the Big Spring Park prior to the race.

The **West Texas Trail Alliance** (WTTA) was recently contacted by the District Manager for Texas Parks and Wildlife. He is very interested in adding more multi-use trails to all of the State Parks in District 1. He recognizes that trails create a big draw to the parks and that they benefit the public. He said he was very happy with the Trail that was built at BSSP and encouraged the WTTA to resubmit the plans for the expanded trail system. The proposed expansion would add 3-5 additional miles of trail for a total of 8-10 miles. Once the proposal is submitted to the State, there will still be some hurdles and some adjustments made. Building on State Park lands will require that the trail does not disturb any Archaeologic sites, fragile soil or wildlife habitat, and does not create erosional problems. The WTTA hopes that trail building will begin as soon as February 2024. Presently the State has not allocated funds in their budget for trail building so funds will need to be raised if the new trails are approved.



The Sweetwater Rattlesnake Gravel Grind benefiting the Volunteer Fire Departments of Nolan County was held at Lake Sweetwater Municipal Park and Campground, March 24 thru March 26. The event was nearly twice as big as last year's inaugural Rattlesnake Gravel Grind. There were 233 cyclists compared to 144 competitors last year. It was a diverse field with riders from ten states, Canada, Mexico, Great Brittan, Holland, and Isreal. The Permian Basin Bicycle Association was well represented with several riders.

The event is part of the Sweetwater Rattlesnake Roundup and was well organized by The Sweetwater Junior Chamber of Commerce (Jaycees), The Volunteer Fire Department, David King, Jimmy Hendrix, Red Hurd, Justin Wilburn, and many volunteers from Sweetwater, Nolan County, and the area.

Covering three days, the Rattlesnake Gravel Grind included a Shake-Out ride on Friday, Races on Saturday, and a Recovery Ride on Sunday. Breakfast every morning and meals after events were served by the Jaycees, Grace Farms Chuckwagon, Bee Décor, First Financial Bank, and Volunteer Firemen. Lawrence Management donated food and supported the event. A full bar was available as well as Non-Alcoholic beer, water, and sports drinks. Many participants camped in the park in RVs and tents or stayed in local lodging at discounted rates.

After high winds on Friday, good weather prevailed, and everyone enjoyed live entertainment in the evenings. On Friday evening, The Michael Aaron Comedy Show had participants grinning and laughing at his offbeat humor. Angelique and the Sweet City Band played a variety of music showcasing her crystal-clear voice and versatility. Saturday evening, we were treated to Country Music, both old and new, by Backroads West and Brendyn Kyle.

In addition to the Rattlesnake Gravel Grind T-shirt, participants drew for western hats provided by Dandy Western Wear, bidons, and other gear. Zoran Sunglasses donated 5 pairs of high quality 'cycling sunglasses. Trek Bikes of Midland and the Sweetwater Chamber of Commerce provided a Trek Checkpoint SLR 6 eTap valued at \$8,000. Rory Boren of Hico, Texas, bought the winning ticket.

On Saturday morning, a morning chill was in the air at the mass start for the main event. Cyclists on gravel bikes, hybrids, and mountain bikes headed out for their 30, 60, and 110 mile Races. The route included paved roads, caliche roads, gravel roads, two track ranch roads, and trails. The roads were in good shape, but sand, ruts, rocks, and mud are just part of the experience in a gravel ride.

Twenty rest stops on the ride were well staffed with Volunteer Firemen, ranchers, and other volunteers. Water, fruit, energy bars and pickles were available. Closer to lunchtime, the volunteers were cooking hotdogs and hamburgers. The riders really appreciated the friendly folks staffing the rest stops, some of which had graciously opened their land to cycling.

The race courses took the cyclists around Lake Sweetwater, into ranch country, through wind farms, oil fields, and up and down hills. Gravel riding allows the cyclist the opportunity to ride on roads and trails that are far away from the pavement. West Texas is flat, except when it is not. Mesas, gullies, canyons, and rock outcrops are abundant in the lands north of Sweetwater. The country is wild, raw, and beautiful.

Several miles into the race, I thought I heard a train in the distance. Then I thought that it was a jet flying overhead. Soon, I realized that it was the sound of wind turbines producing energy. Riding through the wind farms was exciting.

Some of the hills were quite challenging, but the biggest challenge of the day was the West Texas Wind. Fairly early in the morning, the wind started to pick up. Cyclist found themselves riding into a 15 mile per hour headwind for much of the race.
