



THE SPRING CREEK GREENWAY

I visit Spring, Texas north of Houston frequently because my sister lives there. The weather during the winter can be pleasant and warm. The heat and humidity of summer can make cycling less pleasant. I enjoyed my first ride on the Spring Creek Greenway in January. It is a ten foot wide paved trail nearly 20 miles long which is shared with walkers. There is also a horse trail paralleling the paved trail and I seem to remember some signage of horse crossings although I did not see any horses. The paved trail goes through parks. Near the parks there are more dog walkers and children on scooters that riders need to watch out for. I did see one ghost bike indicating that a rider had been killed. Cyclists do need to watch as the trail passes through parks and across park roads. I started at the Dennis Johnston Park and rode south. The trail was well maintained and very enjoyable.
